



House Chimney

Materials


- Small narrow box for chimney stack.
- Small piece of white card for chimney pots.
- Sheet of A4 (Letter size) copy paper.
- Elmer's Glue All or similar.
- Masking tape.
- Black felt tip pen.
- Scissors.
- Rule.




1. A suitable sized box was found to make the chimney stack. Place the long side of this little box against the edge of the roof and draw a diagonal line to show the angle of the slope.




2. Draw a horizontal line across as shown above. On the opposite side, draw another horizontal line from the bottom of the diagonal line, then draw a diagonal line joining the two horizontal lines.




3. Draw a line parallel to the first line 1cm. below, then draw short lines at right angles and cut around the bottom line. Snip up and bend out to make tabs.



4. To make chimneys, cut two strips of card for rolling into tubes, the size depends on the size of the chimneys you need. Remember to leave about 1cm. extra at the bottom to make tabs as shown above.



5. Roll each piece of card and fasten into a tube using glue or tape. Bend up the tabs and glue or tape them to the top of the chimney stack as shown.



6. Tidy up the tabs by gluing white copy paper over them, around the top of the chimney stack.



7. Bend the tabs out, at the base of the chimney stack and tape to the roof.



8. The house and chimney can now be covered with strips of glued white copy paper, ready for painting.
